Learning for the Global Nursing Professional—Student Clinical Learning Objectives

Deans/Faculty desiring to offer an international nursing experience for their students can create options for students to:

- Learn about Russian health care delivery through interacting with Russian patients and other health professionals
- Have the opportunity to do a project on health teaching at an orphanage, children’s rehabilitation center, or mental health center
- Exchange information with Russian nursing students about health care issues and the nursing role in each country

Clinical practicum objectives are achieved through planned observations at clinical sites, completing a project in a health care facility and information exchange through round table discussions.

The clinical experience can be designed to fulfill student clinical/practicum hours. Interpreters are provided to facilitate the interactions, presentations and discussions.

Design Student Clinical Experiences for 21st Century Nursing Practice

Enhance Student Clinical Learning through Experience of Russian Health Care Delivery

Site Visit Options to:

Children’s Rehabilitation Center, Mental health Center, General Hospital, Community Hospice.

Visit to each facility includes:

- 1 hour: Overview of facility, its purpose, kinds of patients served and a facility tour
- 2 hours: Discussion with staff about the nursing role and approaches to care of patients

Student Clinical Experience Options:

Have Teams of 2 students conduct a:

- Health education class on a topic of potential need/interest to children. Topic for teaching and age of children to be taught are determined prior to Russia visit so students can prepare their health teaching. Directions are provided for them to aid in this preparation.
- Community health needs assessment interviewing individuals and families living in a designated area.
